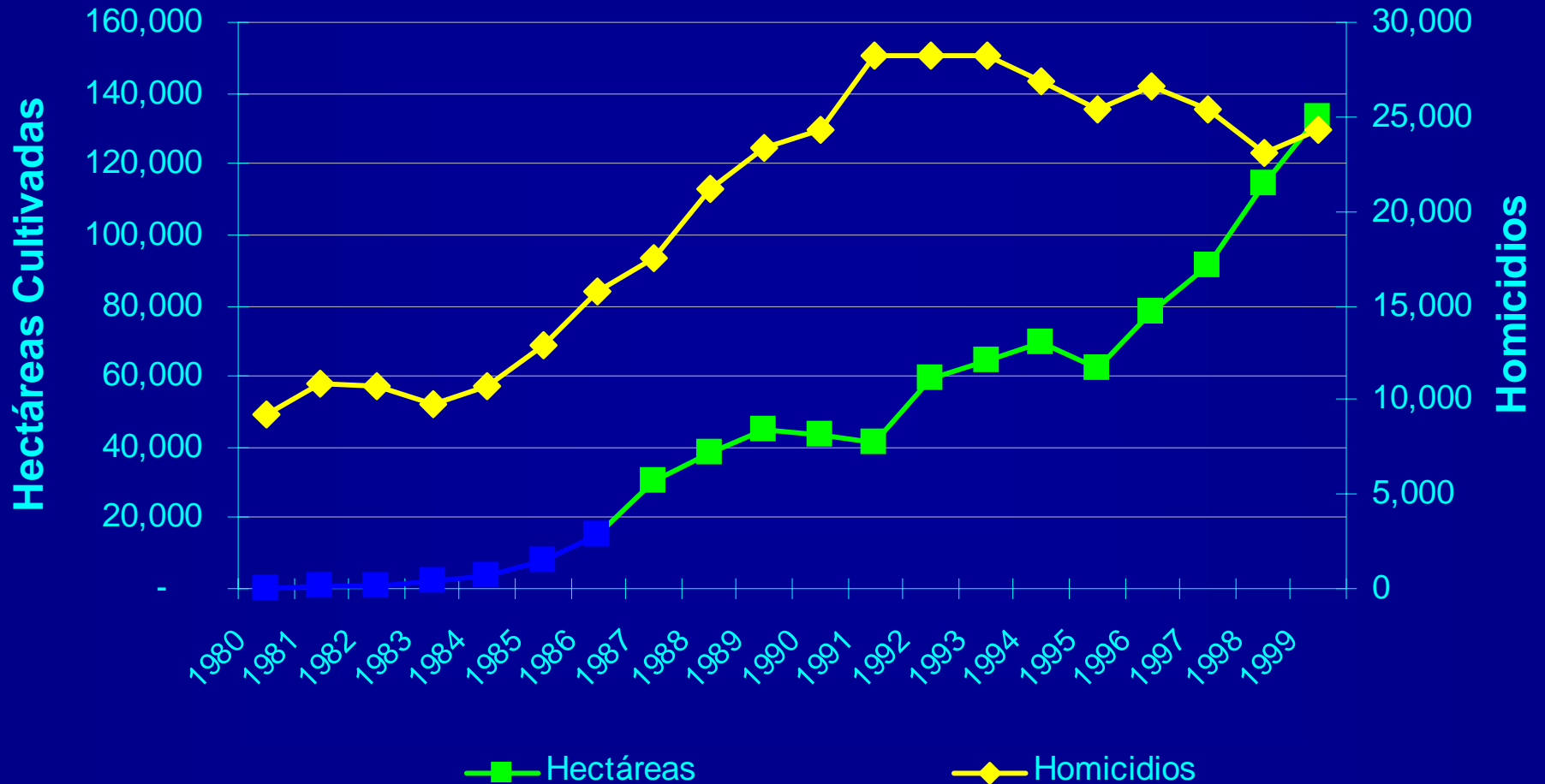
INSTITUTIONAL ACTION PLAN

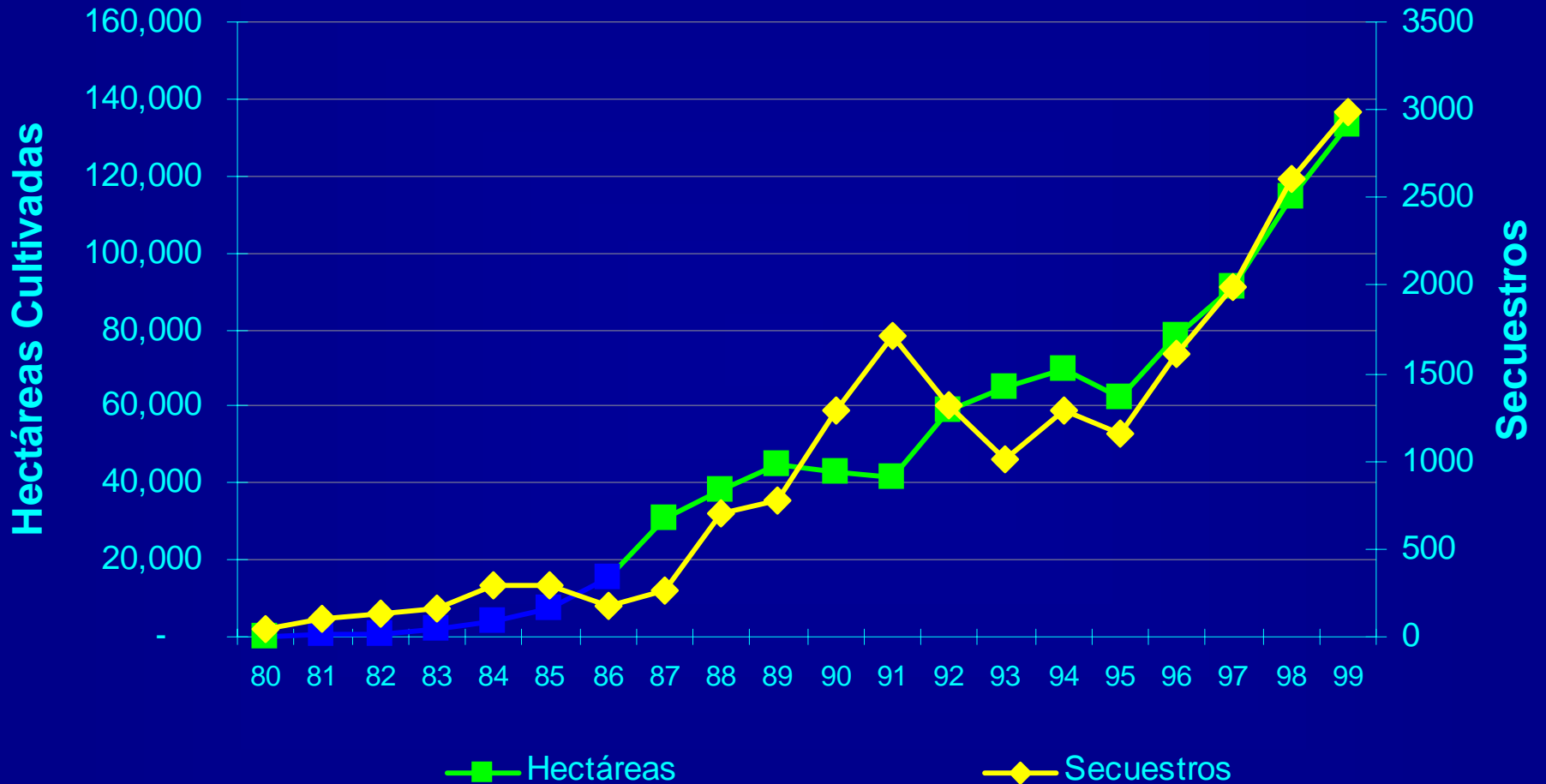

Expansión de Cultivos Ilícitos y Homicidio 1980 - 1999



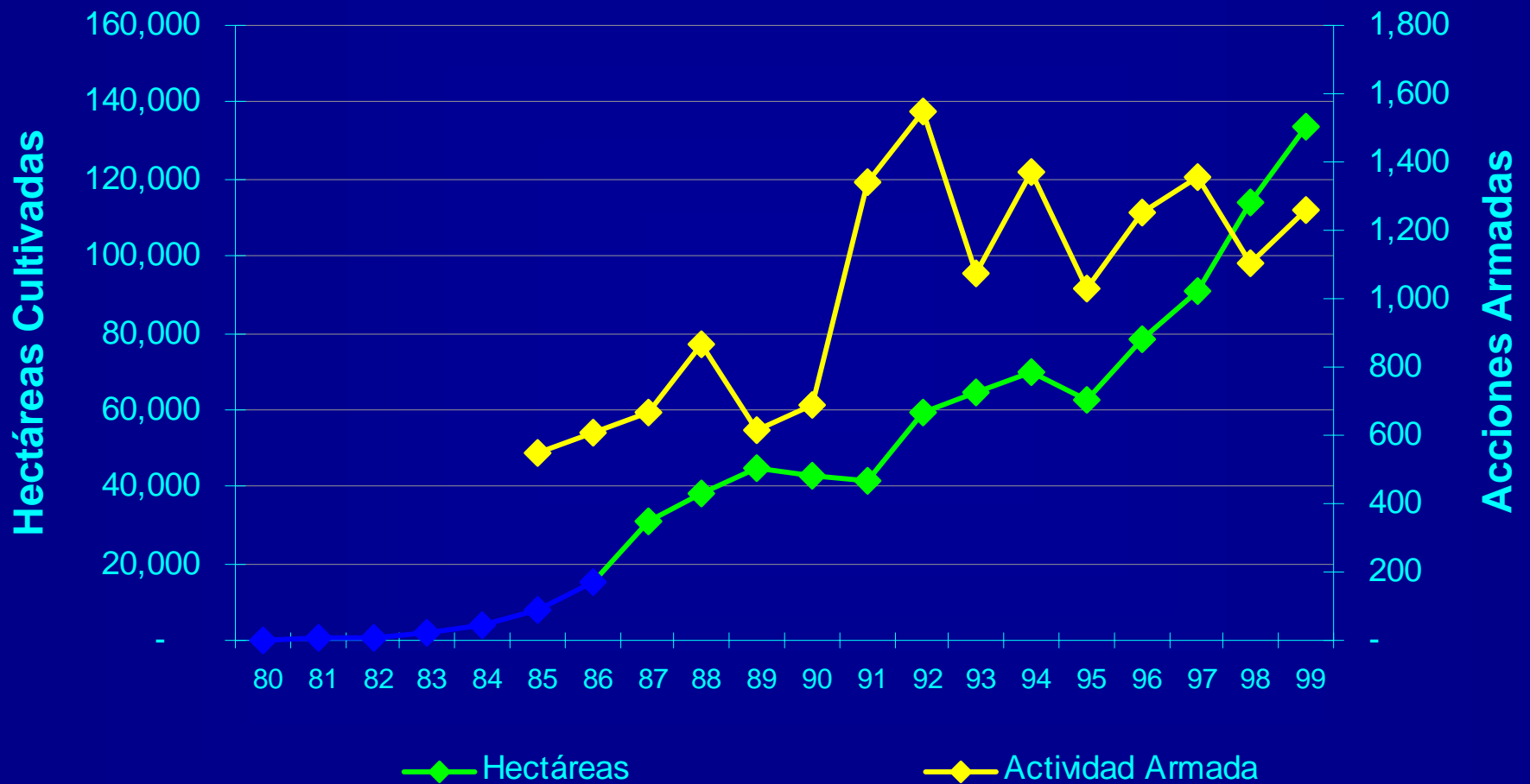

Expansión de Cultivos Ilícitos y Secuestro 1980 - 1999



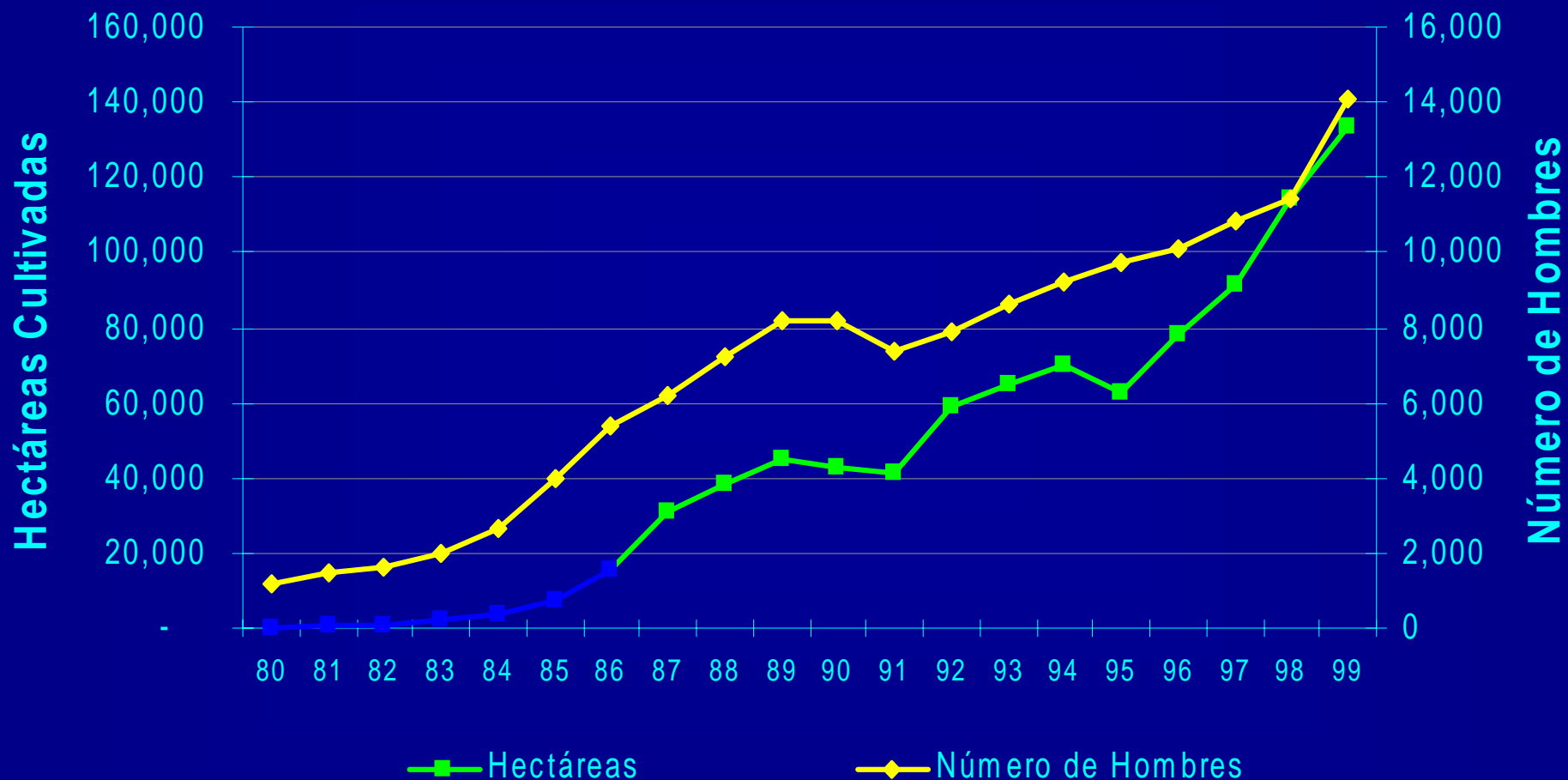

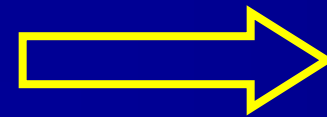
Expansión de Cultivos Ilícitos y Número de Hombres de la Guerrilla 1980 - 1999

Mision

The institutions of the Government of Colombia, as part of the national purpose to build a lasting peace with effective Rule of Law, will conduct coordinated, quick impact actions to: prompt a social and economic recovery with special attention to the most vulnerable population; strengthen the capacity and effectiveness of the State to protect and develop the human, social, natural and physical capital of the country; and effectively reduce the production, processing, and trafficking of illicit substances. Synchronizing these actions will set favorable conditions to advance the political negotiation of the conflict with the insurgency. To maximize the effect, actions will be concentrated in the south of the country during the initial two-year phase, and will then expand nationwide for a period of four years with emphasis in the regions prioritized in Plan Colombia.

AGREEMENTS

GOC

- The GOC involves local and regional authorities into the agreements
- The GOC creates a team to assist the community
- THE GOC invests necessary resources to accomplish the agreed goals and objectives
- The GOC defines monitoring and verification procedures
- Develop short, mid and long terms of productive systems

COMMUNITIES

- Commitment for manual eradication in 12 months
- Community helps in the interaction between the GOC and the people
- Community supports the activities of the GOC
- Community facilitates the application of the verification procedures
